About the Fontainebleau Miami Beach Hotel

Situated on oceanfront Collins Avenue in the heart of Millionaire's Row, the Fontainebleau Miami Beach is one of the most historically and architecturally significant hotels on Miami Beach, Florida. Its iconic design is a spectacular blend of Miami's glamorous golden era and stylish modern luxury. A revered Miami Beach landmark for more than half a century, Morris Lapidus' emblematic curvilinear building sets a new standard for business and pleasure. The 22-acre oceanfront Miami Beach hotel features signature restaurants by award-winning chefs, two chic nightlife venues, a two-story spa, a virtually endless poolscape, miles of pristine beach and state-of-the-art conference and event facilities.

Envisioning the creation of one of the most opulent and magnificent hotels in the world, hotelier Ben Novack purchased the Firestone Mansion, home of auto tire magnate Harvey Firestone in 1952 for \$2.3 million. He tapped Morris Lapidus, who was known for his modernist sensibilities and flair for theatrical spaces, to be the hotel's project architect. When it opened in 1954, Fontainebleau Miami Beach was the largest and most luxurious hotel in South Florida. Its signature features included a 17,000-square-foot lobby with the now-legendary "Stairway to Nowhere," six acres of formal gardens designed to replicate Versailles and thousands of dollars in antique furnishings to authentically convey the hotel's French period theme.

Through the 1950s and 1960s, the hotel reigned as Miami's leading resort and Lapidus' gently curving façade came to symbolize the very essence of Miami Beach. For nearly 25 years, the Miami Beach hotel was so well-known that no sign was necessary to identify it. Celebrities and entertainers, ranging from Elvis Presley and Bob Hope to Lucille Ball and Judy Garland, made the hotel so popular that Novack was once forced to post armed guards to bar non-guests from entering.

Over the years, the Miami Beach oceanfront hotel has costarred in numerous major Hollywood productions including, *Goldfinger*, *The Bellboy*, *Scarface*, *The Specialist* and *The Bodyguard*.

In 2012, the American Institute of Architects granted the Fontainebleau the award for Top Building in Florida, after more than 2.4 million votes cast in the "100 Years. 100 Places." competition.



Andrew Molyneux, MD

Dr. Andrew Molyneux, graduated from Cambridge but spent most of his professional career in Oxford.

After graduation and prior to coming into radiology, he spent 18 months working in Papua New Guinea, including a year in a remote Highlands Hospital, with three doctors serving 200,000 people. This involved doing almost everything from dealing with axe and arrow wounds to Caesarean Sections, anesthetics and autopsies.

After training in radiology in Oxford and spending a year in Denver (where his skiing improved), he returned to a career in neuroradiology and developed an Interventional Neuro-radiology service from early beginnings in 1979 in Oxford.

He has been working the field of stroke and interventional treatment of brain vascular lesions for more than 30 years including the treatment of intracranial aneurysms by endovascular techniques for more than 25 years. He was amongst the first in Europe to use platinum coils to treat otherwise untreatable cerebral aneurysms in the early 1990's and one of the first in Europe to use detachable platinum coils.

He has published widely in many aspects of stroke, subarachnoid hemorrhage and interventional treatment of brain lesions. In recent years, his focus has been on intracranial aneurysm treatment in particular, with a personal experience of well over 1000 cases over the last 25 years.

He started the International Subarachnoid Aneurysm Trial (ISAT) in 1994, which was funded by the UK Medical Research Council in 1997 and is the Co-principal Investigator of the study. He is the first author on two major publications in *The Lancet* in 2002 and 2005 reporting the results of the ISAT study, which has transformed the management of patients with ruptured brain aneurysms in many countries of the developed world.

Dr. Molyneux has retired from active clinical practice but continues as an attachment to the Nuffield Department of Surgical Services, University of Oxford.

His main focus now is on completing a number of research projects, writing papers and spending more time at home with his family. Outside of medicine, his activities include focusing on a need to keep fit, golf (where his objective is to get to a decent handicap), skiing and sailing.

It is an honor for the SNIS to have Dr. Molyneux as our 2019 Luminary Lecturer.
